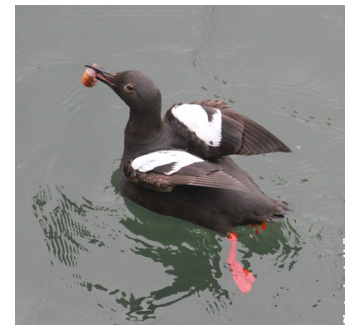


SANCTUARY EXPLORATIONS

COASTAL WILDLIFE WALK

Saturday, March 25th 2017 9:00am-1:00pm



Explore the breathtaking beauty of the wild north coast at Point Arena-Stornetta Public Lands with Farallones sanctuary naturalists and wildlife experts! In spring, seabirds are starting to nest on these cliffs and jagged rocks, and flocks of shorebirds are stopping en route north. Take in panoramas that may include gray whales with newborn calves, traveling slowly as they round the historic Point Arena Lighthouse. Pack a picnic lunch, and learn how and why these lands and waters are federally protected, and about our Beach Watch citizen science program that is monitoring these shores.
