

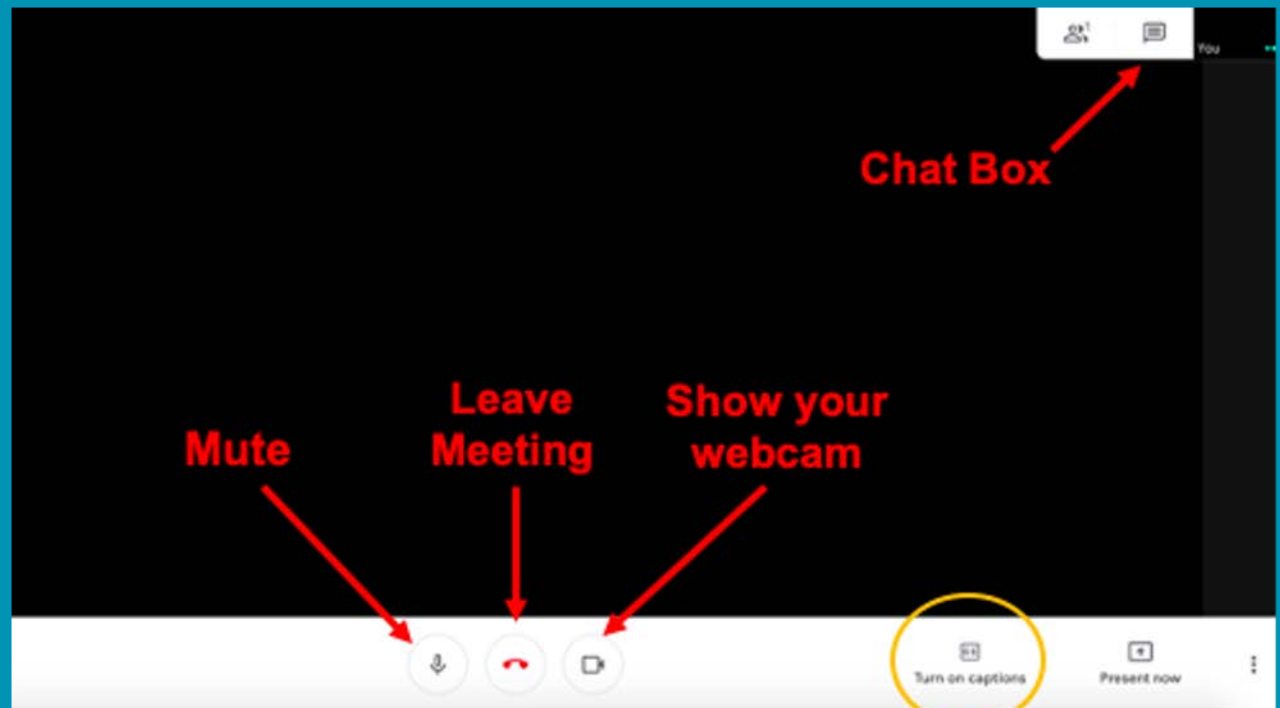

# SAC Procedures Refresher



## Quick refresher on meeting procedures:

- To introduce a meeting topic, bring it to the chair and/or coordinator. The Executive Committee (chair, vice chair, secretary) will decide with the Sanctuary Superintendent if and when it will be brought to the SAC. (~30 days prior)
- To introduce a resolution on a topic already on an upcoming agenda, request a draft resolution template from the coordinator, submit to the chair for further discussion; distribute to SAC ahead of time. (~30 days prior)
- Any member can bring a motion to consider or vote on a resolution during a meeting. For virtual meetings, roll calls will be used to gauge interest and/or vote.
- Members of the same seats are encouraged to communicate regularly on agenda topics; be prepared for either member to represent the sea
